Arkansas Reads One Book

conomics Arkansas is pleased to be assisting with a Family Financial Literacy Initiative for grades K-5 in partnership with Read to Them. Five school districts in Arkansas will be piloting this program this spring and next fall.

The premise of this initiative is for schools and families to read *The Lemonade War* book together and discuss

economic and financial literacy concepts that appear in each chapter. Schools will reinforce the concepts through engaging classroom activities. Each participating district is creating district wide culminating events.

This new resource consists of K-5 cards/guides bundling economic concepts into 12 statements that tell the "story" of economics in a thoughtfully-sequenced manner. Each durable, eight-page, fold-out guide contains a concept background and examples, an introductory

activity, three reproducible activity pages with teaching notes, key points for students to understand, and extension ideas (activities, children's literature connections, online connections, writing prompts, and more).
